INTERNATIONAL DAY OF OLDER PERSONS HOME VISIT 04-10-2024

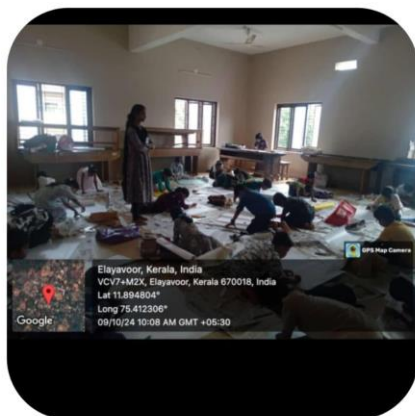

LEARNING AID WORKSHOP 12-12-2024

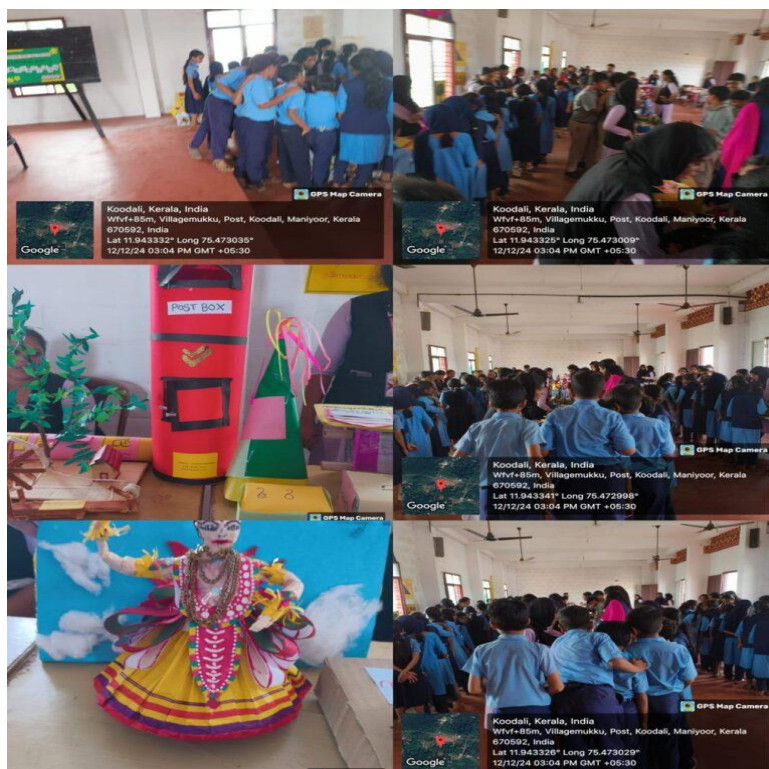
